



HOWARD WAYNE PALMER, JR.

Los Angeles CA: Howard Wayne Palmer, Jr, 57, East Fallowfield, died April 13, 2008, in Los Angeles.

In 1970, he enlisted in the Navy and served in the submarine service until 1980. Howard served a number of years on the Henry L Stimson, tendered out of Rota Spain. He was on the blue crew for this "boomer."

Born September 22, 1951, in Madison, S.D., he was a son of Marilyn (Holvick) Palmer, Annapolis, Md., and the late Howard Palmer Sr. and stepson of Thaddeus Jackson, Annapolis.
