My heart is doing better but I do occasionally have a bad day when my heart is racing - and I'm not LOL

3.10.25: Email from George: Update - I wore a monitor for three days in the middle of Feb, the results from that were good. Previous monitor results showed a LOT of missed beats, slow beats, and other abnormalities. This last report showed as only 1%. The doc was pleased (me too!). As the heart takes about 6-12 months to fully recover from an ablation, we are going to wait another 3 months before making any decisions but it looks like I won't be needing a Watchman (device to prevent strokes). I'm still taking nattokinase and serrapeptase to prevent unwanted clotting/stroke so for now, I think I'm doing good. The heart rate has dropped down to the 80s and BP is running 140/80 more or less. Hopefully in the next three months both BP and rate will continue to improve. All round, good news. I still have some chest pain and shortness of breath but it's nowhere near as bad as it has been. So, thank you GOD for the help and healing!!!

Beware: This Social Security Scam Installs Remote Access Malware on Your PC By Jibin Joseph May 7, 2025

The emails prompt you to download a Social Security statement, but clicking will allow malicious actors to install a remote access tool called ScreenConnect.

Another day, another scam. Cybercriminals are sending fake Social Security emails to trick victims into installing a remote access tool on their computers, Malwarebytes reports.

The emails appear to come from the Social Security Administration (SSA) and prompt you to download a Social Security statement. Quite often, the entire email is in the form of an image, and clicking on the download link will allow malicious actors to install a remote access tool called ScreenConnect.

The Health Corner

Instead of writing about a cancer cure for which I am still gathering information, I'll write about your teeth. Dental care is important at any age as long as you have any of your own teeth. Before you dismiss this article, read the last paragraph.

With all the talk of the dangers of fluoride, you may want to consider making your own tooth paste that is very effective. Ingredients:

- •1/2 teaspoon 3% hydrogen peroxide, foodgrade
- •1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- •3 drops of clove oil
- •1/2 teaspoon microcrystalline hydroxyapatite Combine with 3 teaspoons of water. Store in a s container and brush your teeth with the mixture once daily.

Hydrogen peroxide will whiten teeth and help breakdown the film that is the start of tarter. Baking soda has mild abrasive properties to clean teeth and alkalize the mouth to neutralize the acid that causes cavities. Clove oil is the best essential oil for oral health. It breaks down tartar and can even help decrease oral pain ... We used that when I was a kid for tooth aches. Microcrystalline hydroxyapatite is a minute particle that can enter the small crevices of the teeth and remineralize the bone tissue. It also prevents acid from breaking down the tooth.

For your diet, grass-fed butter is one of the healthiest foods for teeth and is good for the rest of your body as well. It's a potent source of vitamin K2. K2 aids it the absorption of calcium into your bones and teeth. Vitamin A is also found in butter and strengthens your enamel.

Chewing xylitol gum or enjoying xylitol mints will help the good bacteria in your mouth which can be killed off from the hydrogen peroxide.

Mouthwash is not good for your mouth. Sure it makes your mouth smell good but kills the bad

AND the good bacteria. Flossing can help but I have found that a water pick will cleanse out the food and bacteria below the gum line very well. Also, an oral probiotics like L. Reuteri is excellent for promoting good bacteria and mouth health.

Now if you don't want to go through the hassle of the previous ideas, there is another easy way to remove tarter and plaque. I started using one of these devices and my dental hygienist had one comment - "I'm impressed. She couldn't believe how clean my teeth were. That device is a handheld version of what the hygienist uses to clean your teeth. I'm not recommending a particular device but the one I have is amazing. It quickly removed plaque and tarter and it keeps my teeth squeaky clean. Here is an EXAMPLE of a device - not the one I bought. https:// www.amazon.com/CURVY-MOON-Electric-Rechargeable-Cleaning/dp/B0DT44KN6S/ ref=sr 1 17. You can search for "electric plaque remover". They have different options so if you are interested. look around and find one that suits you. Note: Every unit I looked at was made in China or Hong Kong so good luck find one made is the U.S.A.

Oh ... and one other thing - REDUCE your sugar intake. It's nothing but empty calories.

The Computer Corner Pt 2

Changing your iPhone Camera to take photos in JPG/JPEG Format instead of .HEIC/.HEVC. If you are an iPhone or Android phone user and use your phone to take pictures to share with friends and family (and Webmaster Nick at times) then you have likely experienced the issue with not being able to view, and perhaps use those pictures in .HEIC or .HEVC (for videos) format, especially with Windows users.

In the October 2023 Computer Corner the article ".HEIC Picture Files to .JPG" (*aka .JPEG*) covered how to do the conversion of photos between formats.

So historically, where did .HEIC/.HEVC formats come from? Starting with iOS Version 11 in 2017, Apple embraced the format as a more efficient way to store photos to better use the phone memory and take up less space in storage. In iOS Version 14.3 Apple added a Format selection feature for their camera to allow the selection of the prior .jpeg/.jpg format. The two format choices became "High Efficiency" or Most Compatible".

The following video shows you how to make the change:

How To Change Your iPhone Camera From HEIC To JPEG

In a similar manner the Android phone embraced the format starting with Android Version 10

How to change file format of photos on your Android device - simple guide

This should allow you to change from HEIC to .JPG on either phone, and make sharing much easier.

Here is another approach you can use:

.HEIC And here is an approach I have tested and that also works:


Note: Always work on a copy of the photo and not on the original on your phone. I use e-mail to send pictures to my Windows PC, then save them to my incoming.HEIC folder. Pictures are precious, a snapshot in time, and cannot be recreated, so always work on copies of them.

So, what do you do if you have this collection of .HEIC photos and want to move them to a Windows 10 or Windows 11 computer? The following steps may be useful in that effort:

Here is the way to convert..HEIC format pictures to .jpg format on Windows 11:



Create a folder to hold the




incoming HEIC format pictures
Create a folder to hold the converted JPG
photos

Copy the pictures to be converted into the incoming.HEIC file folder

Open the Photos app

You will see something like this:

Next, right click on the "This PC" link to see this:



Click on the "Add folder" button to add the folder for the incoming .HEIC files. You get a file explorer window and then browse to, and select, the folder containing the .HEIC files to be converted.

Next select the folder just added to see the file preview of your incoming files




You can see here that I have 3 test photos displayed...

Select a file to edit and you get this:



Click on the "...", or just type "CTRL+S" to save the file selected for edit in .jpg format to the folder you created for the converted pictures.



This is what you see if you click on the "..." Repeat until all pictures have been converted as you can only do one picture at a time.

And that's it for Windows 11...

Now for windows 10, the process is identical, except you have to buy an add-in for the HVEC formats for \$0.99. I did not need that so I did not go that far, but the process should most likely be identical.

Now if you use one of the "free" .HEIC to .JPG converters in the Microsoft Store, and it appears many of them have their genesis in China, (and some turn out to not be exactly "free" but rather offer a limited trial of from 6 to 15 pictures conversions before they want money), I highly recommend the following sanitization process to protect your location: (actually it's a good practice to follow all of the time when sharing photos!)

For each .HEIC picture you have shared from your iPhone or Android, - I use e-mail to send pictures to my Windows PC, and then save them to the incoming .HEIC folder I created:

Right click on the picture


Select "Properties"

You see this:

Go to the details tab, and click on the "Remove Properties and Personal Information" link and select the first option in the upper left corner to create a copy of the file with personal data removed:

This makes the file property look like this:

Note that the "GPS" information has now been removed...






Then you can convert to .JPG format... Once converted, the privacy of the .HEIC file as carried to the .JPG file and privacy of location is protected.

Now you have .JPG images to share with friends and family who may be Windows users and make these photos much easier to use.

Windows Recall and Timeline

As you embrace Windows 11, there is a feature that you need to be aware of that has, in my opinion, some troubling implications. It exists on Windows 11 PC's running Version 24H2. I discovered this feature while reading an article on Computerworld.com related to the recent Signal messaging app debacle that made headlines. Signal to Windows Recall: Drop dead

Windows Recall is an Al-powered feature designed for Copilot+ PCs running Windows 11 version 24H2 and newer that continuously takes snapshots of your screen to create a searchable timeline of your activities. It can allow apps you use to do the same thing – which may be concerning for us all.

I am running Windows 11 24H2 on a Dell Laptop (which is a laptop that does not have the hardware embedded AI capability now being offered in new PC's), so I checked the setting and here's what I saw down at the bottom of the Privacy & Security page:

Copilot+ PC's will likely more closely match the article steps.

I was not aware of this feature, but immediately disabled it. Fortunately, my apps have not requested access as noted by the "0" requests value. But what happens when the apps get their software updated and that capability added? I'm not taking that chance. My data is too valuable, and private.

WASHINGTON – The Department of Veterans
Affairs today announced changes that will make it
easier for VA-enrolled Veterans to access health
care from non-VA providers at the department's
expense.

Since 2019, the MISSION Act has enabled VAenrolled Veterans to access health care from non-VA providers at the department's expense when it is in their best medical interest. These decisions have been made jointly by Veterans and their referring clinicians but were not considered final until they were reviewed by a second VA doctor.

Effective immediately, VA will implement language in the <u>Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st</u> <u>Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits</u> <u>Improvement Act</u> that removes this extra review step. The change will give eligible Veterans faster access to community care.

"Under President Trump, VA is providing Veterans with more health care choices than ever before," aid VA Secretary Doug Collins. "Now, we're making it even easier for Veterans to get their health care when and where its most convenient for them. We are putting Veterans first at the department, and that means placing a premium on customer service and convenience. This important change will help us do just that."

Background

Since 2019, the MISSION Act has given eligible Veterans the option of seeking community care outside VA when they meet any one of six conditions:

- When it is in the best medical interest of the Veteran.
- The care required is not available at a VA medical facility.
- The Veteran lives in a state or territory that does not have a full-service VA facility
- VA cannot meet wait time or distance standards:
- o VA cannot offer an appointment within 20 days for primary care, mental health or non-institutional extended care, or within 28 days for specialty care.
- o It takes more than a 30-minute drive to reach primary or mental health care, or a 60-minute drive for specialty care.
- VA service does not meet certain quality

standards.

The Veteran meets the grandfathered distance and location provisions of the former Veterans Choice Program.

The new, streamlined process for determining best medical interest will be backed by training for Veterans Health Administration employees to ensure compliance with the Elizabeth Dole Act.

Sunken USS Yorktown Leaves Researchers 'Flabbergasted' In Latest Dive

(NAVY TIMES 12 MAY 25) ... Claire Barrett Eighty-three years after sinking, the USS Yorktown is still revealing secrets.

During an April 19 expedition, scientists with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) — as part of the Beyond the Blue: Papahānaumokuākea ROV and Mapping project — were using a remotely operated underwater vehicle to explore the storied U.S. Navy aircraft carrier, when they found more than they could have hoped for.

Since June 1942, the 809-foot-long carrier has been resting on the ocean floor, slipping beneath the waves after Japanese forces torpedoed the ship during the Battle of Midway.

Resting 3.1 miles beneath the surface and roughly 1,000 miles northwest of Honolulu, the Yorktown was first discovered in 1998 by Robert Ballard in coordination with the National Geographic Society and the U.S. Navy.

An initial investigation of the shipwreck was conducted that year upon its discovery. Another, led by Ocean Exploration Trust on Exploration Vessel Nautilus, was launched in 2023. The April 19 dive, however, was the first exploratory expedition of its kind — revealing a host of discoveries.

During the dive, at least three Douglas SBD Dauntless bombers were found on the ship's hanger deck — with one plane still fully armed after 83 years, its bomb secured in its release cradle.

The other two, according to NOAA, are believed to have been part of the USS Enterprise's bombing squadron that landed on the Yorktown

after releasing their payload. During the battle, SBDs were responsible for fatally damaging all four Japanese carriers.

These Dauntless bombers bear the scars of battle, with records showing that the pair were moved to the hangar deck and set ablaze after being struck by three Japanese bombers.

The cameras, meanwhile, picked up more than just the vestiges of battle.

A hand-painted mural that reads "A Chart of the Cruises of the USS Yorktown" was found inside one of the vessel's elevator shafts. The mural, only partially visible in historic photographs taken before the ship's sinking, revealed itself for the first time to researchers.

The mural, which stretches 42 feet end to end and 12 feet top to bottom, was seemingly painted by a crew member to track the Yorktown's voyage across the world.

During the live-feed of the dive, researchers were astounded by the almost perfectly preserved map.

"This is the first time we're seeing this whole image. This is history in the making," one researcher said as the camera turned its view onto the mural.

"That is amazing," another noted. "I am absolutely flabbergasted by the state of preservation of this."

While murals were occasionally painted on other ships during World War II, the Yorktown's had seemingly been lost to history — until now.

"Its motifs showcase the pride that Yorktown's sailors had for their ship, the global scale of Yorktown's activities, and the strategic role that the ship played in defending the United States," NOAA said in a news release.

Along with the aircraft and aircraft debris in Yorktown's hangar, the mural is helping to fill gaps in the historical record of the Yorktown.

The 28-day expedition, according to NOAA, has provided "answers to existing questions and result [ed] in new mysteries for historians and scientists to puzzle out."

One such mystery is the "surprise automobile" researchers discovered during the April 19 dive.

"Based on the flared fenders, split windshield, rag top, chrome details and spare tire, researchers have tentatively identified the vehicle as a black 1940-1941 Ford Super Deluxe

'Woody,'" the Smithsonian noted.

On its front plate, according to a statement, researchers could make out the words "SHIP SERVICE NAVY."

The presence of the car on the aircraft carrier has puzzled researchers and historians alike. Even more puzzling was the fact that crew members didn't push the "Woody" overboard after Capt. Elliot Buckmaster, in an effort to keep the ship afloat, gave the order to jettison heavy cargo that included the likes of guns and aircraft.

For now, researchers can only surmise as to why the vehicle survived the jettison order.

Another mystery for another dive.

Navy to scrap historic platforms used to salvage doomed USS Arizona

Work will begin Monday to permanently remove a pair of dilapidated platforms that were connected to the USS Arizona during salvage operations following its sinking in the 1941 Japanese surprise attack.

Workers with the U.S. Navy and Pearl Harbor National Memorial will place containment buoys and anchors in the waters surrounding the USS Arizona Memorial site as a precautionary measure and in preparation for removing the platforms, the Navy said in a news release Thursday.

"Ultimately, the Navy decided to remove the historic platforms to prevent possible damage to the USS Arizona, its memorial and the environment," the release states.

The platforms were welded to the hull of the Arizona, which sits mostly below water in Pearl Harbor, during a lengthy salvage operation in the wake of the attack on Dec. 7, 1941.

Ferries, barges and ships tethered to the platforms as workers stripped parts critical to the war effort.

In October 2023, memorial staff discovered the smaller of the two platforms had shifted, with its concrete surface now inclined diagonally in the water.

Navy and National Park Service divers assessed the condition of both platforms and the ship's hull in the months after the decay was found.

"After a year of focused planning and analysis, the installation of this mooring system is a necessary precaution to ensure environmental protection ahead of removing the platforms later this year," the Navy said. "Additionally, this action supports the platform removal emergency response plan."

The Pearl Harbor National Memorial had hoped the platforms could be repaired rather than removed.

"Our mission at the National Park Service is not just Dec. 7, 1941," David Kilton, a spokesman for the memorial, told Stars and Stripes in November 2023. "It's the lead-up to the attacks, the actual attack and the aftermath, continuing all the way to peace and reconciliation — a story still playing out today."

The platforms tell a part of that story, he said. The Navy, however, said in its news release that removing the platforms "will symbolize the completion of a salvage operation that began more than 80 years ago, involving the efforts of the U.S. Navy's diving and salvage force, and thousands of contractors and shipyard workers drawn from the people of Hawaii and many different local communities."

The USS Arizona Memorial opened in 1962 and honors the 1,177 crewmen who died on the battleship. The remains of 900 sailors and Marines were entombed in the doomed vessel as it sank.

It receives about 2 million visitors a year.

The plan for removing the platforms complies with state and federal laws and regulations, the Navy said.

"Additionally, all efforts will be coordinated with the Pearl Harbor National Memorial and local officials to ensure the platform removal fully respects the ship's historic importance to the nation and its sacred status as a war grave," the news release states.



Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, or odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call **9-1-1**.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

Charging an E-bike

Charge your battery in a flat, dry area away from children, direct sunlight, liquids, tripping hazards, and in a location where the e-bike is not at risk of falling.

Using FamousKin.com Program to Connect Two Ancestors



We have discussed using the FamousKin program in other articles to find notable, famous, or infamous ancestors and add them to our tree. Sometimes this can be a daunting process, especially if you see there are a lot of ancestors between the two people you are trying to connect.


In this article we want to describe a general process to use when adding connections between two distant people contained in the **FamousKin** program. When we look at the connection between the two people it may show a large number of generations between them. One or both of the people at the top and bottom of the connections may already be in our tree and we are trying to connect them together.

Suppose for example that **Britney Spears** is in our tree. If we open **FamousKin.com** and type **Britney Spears** in **Enter search criteria** we see an entry for Britney Spears (Britney Spears Famous Kin (16614).

When we click on this link, it brings up the following screen with all the famous or notable kin of Britney Spears.



Note that **Hugh le Bigod** is shown who is also an ancestor of both Tom (24th great-grandfather and Don (7th cousin 21X removed). Hugh le Bigod is Britney's 26th great-grandfather. When we click on Hugh le Bigod we get the following screens showing the connection path from Britney Spears to Hugh le Bigod.




There are a total of 27 ancestors shown between them. If we want to add the connection between Britney Spears and Hugh le Bigod it could be a daunting task to keep track of all the people in between them. Some of the people shown may already be in your tree that are in that list of kin.

As discussed in previous articles, you should be using split screens (or two monitors) during this process. The **FamousKin** screen should be in one "browser," such as **Microsoft Edge**, on the left side of the monitor and on the right side of the screen, open another "browser," such as **Google Chrome**, in which you open Ancestry.com in the 1st tab. On the right browser, open the Ancestry profile for Britney Spears in the 1st tab on the right screen and then click on the 2nd tab and open the Ancestry profile for Hugh le Bigod in the 2nd tab. Looking at FamousKin on the left browser on the screen, we can compare it to the Ancestry Profiles on the right side. There may already be some of these people in your tree from both of these people. Look at Britney Spears' Ancestry Profile, you can follow her parents and grandparents up to see where in the FamousKin path our Ancestry tree for Britney stops. Looking at Hugh le BiGod's children and click on the person listed at the top of the next FamousKin box below Hugh le Bigod (Isabel le BiGod). Keep repeating this process and at some point, you will reach a person that is not already in your tree and they will have to be added to complete the connection.

When using FamousKin.com, if you are trying to work upward (from Britney Spears), you have to know which of the parents will continue the path upward toward the person you are trying to reach. If you are starting at the top person (Hugh le Bigod), the FamousKin program will a**utomatically** show the next child down the path necessary to get to Britney Spears. Thus, it is generally easier to work **down** FamousKin in order to complete the path to the person you are trying to connect, Britney Spears.

If you want to leave the complete path displayed on the left browser, you can open a 2nd tab on the left browser and open another copy of Britney Spears' FamousKin in the 2nd tab. Then click on Hugh le

Bigod in that tab to show the complete FamousKin path. With the path showing, click on Hugh le Bigod to open his profile in FamousKin.



Since we are starting with Hugh le Bigod, on the right side of your screen in Ancestry, open the Ancestry Profile for Hugh le Bigod. Verify the information from FamousKin in his Ancestry Profile. After verifying information, we see that FamousKin lists Isabel le Bigod (in blue) as the next person down the path. It also gives some Notes (Magna Carta Surety; 3rd Earl of Norfolk) about Hugh le Bigod you should ensure are added to Ancestry. Tom has Tree Tags for **Magna Carta Surety** and **Royalty** which he also adds to Ancestry for Tree Searches later. Tree Tags were discussed in a previous article. There are also other siblings listed that you can add to Ancestry if not already in Ancestry. For these siblings add **FK** to the Suffix field to show they are contained in FamousKin. If you do not have their birth information you can "assume" they were born about the same time as Isabel (Abt. 1212) and use **Abt. 1212** for their birth dates until you find better references for their birth dates. If we had a marriage date we could use dates after the marriage. Note that at the bottom of the FamousKin Profile there is a link to Wikipedia:

If we open this link, we will get more information about Hugh le Bigod to add to Ancestry which may fill in some of the missing information above. We would also add it as a **Web link** to Ancestry.

Since Isabel le Bigod is next in the path down to Britney Spears, we click on her Profile in Ancestry and also click on her Profile in FamousKin. We would add information from FamousKin to Ancestry including opening up her spouse, John FitzGeoffrey. If we did a Tree Search on John FitzGeoffrey, we might discover that he is already in our tree (22nd grand-uncle). Thus, we could Merge these Profiles, if

we already added him, or we could add him as an existing person (**Choose someone from your tree.**) in Ancestry as her spouse. We see that Maud FitzJohn is the next person down the FamousKin path. Note that other siblings are also given that we can add. Since a marriage date is provided (Aft. 1230), we can assume that Joan was born after 1230 so we could use Abt. 1231 for her assumed birth date until better information is obtained.

Notice that Isabel's FamousKin Profile also lists an additional spouse (Gilbert de Lacy) which we can add to Ancestry. Since no other information is provided, we can assume Gilbert was born "about" the same time as Isabel so use Abt. 1212 for his birth information in Ancestry until better information is available.

Notice that Isabel also has a WikiPedia link for her that we can open and get more information. Add a Web link for the WikiPedia source to Ancestry.

Next, we move down to Maud FitzJohn in both FamousKin and Ancestry and repeat the process above.

As you add people to Ancestry you may want to perform a **Tree Search** in Ancestry to determine if that person's name may already be somewhere in your tree. If you find the same or similar names you then want to look at the details in both FamousKin and Ancestry to determine if that person is indeed the same person already in your tree or not. Maybe they are the spouse of someone already in your tree who was added before. In that case you would want to **Merge** these people in Ancestry. After merging these records, determine if the **Merge** added some people already in the FamousKin line. Continue to work down the FamousKin list until you have connected Britney Spears to Hugh le Bigod.

As you add each person to Ancestry, you should add **FK*** to the Suffix field in Ancestry to show that it was a Profile from **FamousKin.com**. If they are listed, but not in the path, we can add **FK** to the Suffix field to show they are listed in FamousKin but we did not open their actual profile.

Continue moving down the FamousKin path until you finally connect to Britney Spears in Ancestry.

Once you add Britney Spears, you should add a Web link to her FamousKin page using **Add web link** in Ancestry. After Britney Spears is added, we see that Britney is Tom's 18th cousin 1x removed and Don's (28th cousin 6x times removed) going to Hugh le Bigod. There may be shorter paths that we discover later making her a much closer cousin but for now we have established a link to our trees.

Also, note that she has a WikiPedia link to get more information about her you will want to add.

Then you can add Tree Tags to use for future searches, such as: Actor_Actress, FamousKin; Grammy Award; Recording Artist_Composer; or any other Tree Tags you want to create (We have discussed Tree Tags in a previous article.) In the Suffix field you could add information such as **FK*** (Singer, Songwriter, Dancer, Actress).

We could now choose a different FamousKin person for Britney that we may recognize from our tree and repeat the process from the beginning looking for different ancestor paths. This may make a shorter path and make Britney a closer cousin.

As we write this Memorial Day message, it is with a sense of pride and sorrow that we remember the brave Submariner's who have lost their lives in the Undersea Services in which we have all served Last year, we gathered at the Cliffs of Moher in the Republic of Ireland, the high cliff of Europe, looking out over the Atlantic Ocean; to honor and pray for those "who gave their last full measure of devotion" – Lincoln.

Mindful that the loss of one life is a grievus occurrence, Michael Setzer, HOD Germany, stepped up to read the number of personnel lost to his country. He reported a staggering figure of over 30,000 sailors, which moved us tremendously. It was also deeply touched those in attendance to have Tony Faella, a WWII USN veteran, present with us.

We would be grateful if countries we missed could send us their information along with a photo of your Submariners Memorials so that we may add it to this page for future ISA tributs.

27 May 2024 at the Cliffs of Moher in the Republic of Ireland

(Bud Cunnally) Welcome to the Memorial Service for our sisters and brothers who have answered the call and received their orders to the Eternal Patrol. We who now have the watch call upon the Nations of the International Submariners Association to speak for them.

We call upon the individual countries here assembled to state the number of Submarines their country has lost in Wartime and Peacetime and how many of their sailors Perished. We also want to remember those who have been lost in service and not on Submarines.



(Steve Day) The USA has lost 74 submarines and more than 4,300 sailors since 1901. The USA's largest loss of life came in WWII; there were 52 subs lost and 3,506 sailors killed. This man standing next to me is a hero, and I am honored and humbled to be a fellow brother of the Phin. (Bud) I served with many of them in the 1960s as they finished their 20 years of service and retired from the US Navy. They were my heroes then, and they are still my heroes today. Tony Faella, are we not fortunate to have you with us today? Tony is a youngster who has celebrated his 102nd birthday



He served on board the USS Spearfish (SS 190) on five war patrols in the Pacific and is a survivor of the 1 in five men lost in the Pacific theater of World War II. Bud Cunnally is a surviving family member of his first cousin, James Patrick Cunnally, who was lost on the USS Seawolf (SS197). USA peacetime losses are set at 22 Subs.



(Ian Vickers) United Kingdom. 135 were sunk with the loss of Six Thousand Submariners, who have died in service since 1901. We are close to the home of Captain Bill King who served in the British Navy on board Royal Navy Submarines, and we will learn more about this incredible Submariner later today at his home at Oranmore Castle, Galway. The National Submariners' War Memorial, is a war memorial on the Victoria Embankment in London, England, between Waterloo Bridge and Blackfriars Bridge.



(Michael Setzer) Germany No country has lost more Submariners than Deutschland. 200 U-boats lost in World War 1 with 4,744 sailors and 739 U-boats in World War 2 have gone to the bottom with the loss of over 30,000 sailors. Their Allies the Austro-Hungarians in WW 1 lost 9 submarines and 95 sailors, and the Italians in WW 2 lost 95 submarines with a total of 1,071 Submariners. In peacetime, Germany lost three submarines in accidents 1911 U-3, 1936 U-18, and in 1966 U-Hai.

(Dominique Salles) France: Among 1650 submariners who have lost their lives from 1905 to the present time, 1100 disappeared during World War 1 and 2 conflicts. Twelve subs sank in peacetime. In less than two years, in 1968 and 1970, the loss of both Minerve and Eurydice was excruciating with the death of 109 submariners. The Eurydice was found a few months after the shipwreck, and Minerve was not discovered until 2019, 51 years after its sinking, offering the families of these missing submariners the opportunity to mourn.

(Michail Proimakis) Greece HS PROTEUS S-3. sank in the Adriatic west of the Greek island of Sasson, on 29 December 1940, with its 48 members. HS GLAFKOS S-6 was in Valletta, Malta for an overhaul. On 27 February 1942, the port of Valletta was attacked by the enemy air force, and the Commander of the submarine, and an officer were killed. On 04 April 1942, the port was again assaulted by the combative air force and the submarine sank. HS TRITON S-5. On 16 November 1942, it was sunk by embolization close to the island of Evia with the loss of 24 (two were British) and 28 of the crew captured, while two escaped by swimming to the island of Evia. HS KATSONIS S-1. It sank on 14 September 1943, at the North Island of Skiathos, with 32 crew members lost and 17 captured. Three escaped by swimming to the coast of Pelion.

(Sid Czabotar) Australia Two submarines lost in WW1. Submarine AE1 was lost off the coast of New Britain on 14 September 1914 with thirty-five officers and crew. AE 1 was located and identified on 20 December 2017. AE2 was scuttled on 30 April 1915 off the coast of Turkey during WW1. All crew were captured with 4 dying in captivity. AE2 was located and identified in June 1988.

(Stein Flom-Jacobsen) Norway One submarine *Uredd* (*P41*) lost 34 sailors (including 3 British) and 6 soldiers from Norwegian Independent Company no.1 (Linge Commandos) together with 1 Special Intelligence Service (SIS) agent. Uredd was detected in 1985 and is a war grave with a memorial on the mainland close by. None lost in peacetime.

Other than Submarines Norway lost 672 ships and approximately 4800 sailors (at sea) during WWII. This includes both the Merchant Navy and the "home fleet". The Royal Norwegian Navy lost 933 sailors (approx. 46%) and 37 ships/vessels.

(Lars Nordenberg) Sweeden Loss of HM Submarine ULVEN On April 15, 1943, the greatest tragedy in the history of the Swedish submarine force occurred. The submarine Ulven was blown up by a mine in Swedish territorial waters, killing all 33 crew members. An entire nation mourned. Our country was not heavily affected by the atrocities of war, but it still suffered a great loss of life. It was a difficult time that followed the disaster, especially for relatives, friends, and submarine companions.

(Israel)

INS Dakar was a <u>diesel-electric submarine</u> in the <u>Israeli Navy</u>. The vessel, a modified <u>World War II British T-class submarine</u>, was purchased by <u>Israel</u> from the <u>Government of the United Kingdom</u> in 1965. Dakar and her entire 69-man crew were lost en route to Israel on 25 January 1968. Despite extensive searches over the course of three decades, its wreckage was not found until 1999, when it was located between the islands of <u>Cyprus</u> and <u>Crete</u> at a depth of approximately 3,000 m (9,800 ft). The Submarine's <u>conning tower</u> was salvaged and is on display outside the Naval Museum in <u>Haifa</u>. The exact cause of Dakar's sinking remains unknown.



(I Choi Lee) Republic of Korea The ROKS Cheonan sinking occurred on 26 March 2010, when <u>Cheonan</u>, a <u>Pohang-class corvette</u> of the <u>Republic of Korea Navy</u>, carrying 104 personnel, sank off the country's west coast near <u>Baengnyeong Island</u> in the <u>Yellow Sea</u>, killing 46 seamen. The cause of the sinking remains in dispute. An international team of experts investigated, which concluded that the warship was sunk by a North Korean Torpedo fired by a Midget Submarine. God rest their Souls.



(Yevgen Livshyts) Ukraine. Until December 1991, Ukraine as a Union Republic was part of the Soviet Union, we Ukrainians served on submarines alongside representatives of the other 14 Union Republics, together defending our common state. In the battles of World War II, 110 Soviet submarines were lost, and the sea took in 3,374 submariners. After World War II, the Soviet Navy lost 8 diesel and 4 nuclear submarines, and 769 submariners died in these disasters and accidents on other submarines. Today we also mourn the deaths of 38 thousand military personnel and 10 and a half thousand civilians, including about 500 children, from the Russian aggressive invasion of Ukraine. (Skip Whitfield) Canada During World War II, The Royal Canadian Navy fielded 341 fighting ships. Of that number 21 were lost.

(Bud Cunnally) The Republic of Ireland Since the 1960s, 88 personnel (87 from the <u>Irish Army</u> and one from the <u>Air Corps</u>) have died in overseas deployments. The deployments were mostly serving the United Nations Peacekeeping Force, The First World War accounted for about 35,00 men killed. The Irish War for Independence and the Civil War produced hundreds of fatalities.
